

## Flexible Spending Accounts

Expenses must be incurred during the plan year in order to be eligible for reimbursement. Mercer's Plan Year begins July 1<sup>st</sup> and ends June 30<sup>th</sup>. All over-the-counter (OTC) items marked with a  $\blacklozenge$  require a note of medical necessity from a licensed practitioner.

Below is a list of commonly eligible medical items and services. Final eligibility is determined based upon the IRS guidelines for that tax year. Learning disability (fees paid to a special school or tutor for a child with severe learning disabilities caused by a medical or physical impairment, provided that the child's physician recommends that the child attend the school or be tutored)

Massage therapy (only is prescribed by a physician for a specific diagnosis and provided by a licensed massage therapist) Medical Services provided by physicians, surgeons, and specialists (for non cosmetic services only)
